



The Top 8 Causes of False Fire Alarms in Businesses - and How to Prevent Them

False fire alarms can be disruptive and costly for businesses, leading to:

- 1. Unnecessary evacuations and downtime
- 2. Frustrated customers
- 3. Fire brigade fees
- 4. Unnecessary insurance claims
- 5. Risks to those experiencing real emergencies
- 6. Complacency and reduced confidence in the Fire Detection & Alarm system

The good news is that most false fire alarms are preventable by understanding and managing the common causes.



Common Causes & Prevention of False Fire Alarms



1. Fumes/Gases

Causes:

Painting/Decorating, Vehicle Emissions, Cooking, Oil Fired Boilers Cleaning/Sterilisation

Prevention:

- Use heat detectors where legislation and the risk allows such as in kitchens/canteens.
- Close doors and ensure extract systems are functional during cooking.
- Consult with your fire alarm maintenance provider in advance of undertaking any renovations, remedial or deep cleaning works.

2. Steam

Causes:

Dishwashers, Burco Boilers, Kettles, Showers, Steam Cleaning

Prevention:

- Consider switching to multi-sensors or heat detectors where legislation and the risk allows.
- Keep doors closed when using showers and use extractor fans.
- Avoid placing burco boilers or kettles directly under detectors.

3. Smoke


Causes:

Cigarette Smoke, Electronic Cigarette Vapours, Smoke Machines, Candles, Smoke from nearby areas

Prevention:

- Clearly mark designated smoking areas.
- Inform staff and customers that electronic cigarettes can trigger detectors.
- Ensure proper separation between smoking areas and other parts of the building.
- Avoid burning candles where possible.
- Close windows and doors where there is a risk of smoke ingress from nearby areas.





4. Aerosols

Causes:

Cleaning Products, Deodorants, Air Fresheners

Prevention:

- Avoid spraying aerosols near detectors.
- Position automatic air fresheners away from detectors.
- Train cleaning staff on proper usage.

5. Hot Work

Causes:

Welding, Soldering, Plumbing, Drilling, Grinding, Cutting, Sanding, Carpentry, Tiling

Prevention:

- Implement a permit system smoke or dust generating tasks.
- Brief external contractors on the Fire Detection & Alarm system.
- Covering detectors during works can help to reduce contamination. However, it is essential
 that the covers are removed at the end of each working day.

6. Environmental

Causes:

Weather, Humidity, Temperature Fluctuations, Insect Ingress, Moisture/Water Ingress

Prevention:

- Use multi sensors in areas with frequent changes in air flow where legislation and the risk allows.
- If you notice a lot of insects around your detectors, wipe the outside of the detector housing with a cloth and insect repellent. Avoid spraying repellent directly on or towards the detector.
- Maintain consistent room temperatures and practice good building maintenance.





7. Accidental or Malicious Damage

Causes:

Staff, Customers, Visitors, Contractors

Prevention:

- Protect equipment such as break glass units with approved covers or cages especially in high traffic areas such as corridors etc.
- Use CCTV to deter malicious activations.
- Create awareness by providing staff training.

8. Equipment Malfunction, System Testing & Maintenance

Causes:

Equipment failure, Improper configuration of Fire Detection & Alarm System, Fire Alarm Testing, Maintenance of other Systems.

Prevention:

- Only use accredited Fire Detection & Alarm system providers for installation, servicing, and maintenance works.
- Maintain your system in accordance with Irish Standards and plan for upgrades especially if older than 10 years.
- Schedule routine tests and notify staff/customers in advance.

What to do after a False Fire Alarm:

- Investigate and identify the cause to prevent reoccurrence.
- Record the activation in your fire register/fire alarm logbook.
- Reset the fire alarm control panel.
- If you experience frequent false fire alarms, consult your fire alarm maintenance provider.
